

Opening up of New Areas and Gardening Construction Work

You may have noticed that we have opened up the area near the stage through to the Yarning Circle in the bottom southern corner of the oval. We are delighted that we have been able to achieve this and now we are hoping to bring back our chickens and start growing things in our veggie patch. The only area left now is our school oval which the students have been helping me prepare and put down grass seed. This area was rolled by the builders and then seed put on top. We are now breaking up this surface and putting more seed down so hopefully we can get this growing ready to open up this area in the spring. Fingers crossed the grass seed survives and we are able to get our oval back again. The last part of the project which will have lasted eighteen months!



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FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.
